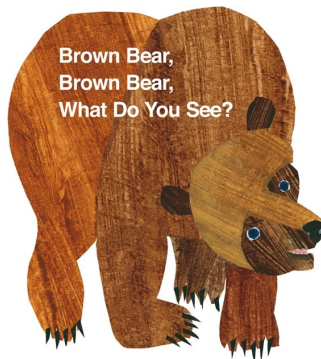

BEFORE READING...



- ▶ Read the title and help your child predict what might happen. You could say; "I think we are going to see lots of things. What might they be?"
- ▶ Has your child read *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* or any other books by Eric Carle? His illustration style is easy to spot and your child might enjoy seeing both books together to compare.

WHILE READING...



- ▶ The rhyme makes this book so engaging; you can bounce from page to page.
- ▶ After hearing you read it a few times your child can join in with asking "What do you see?"
- ▶ The last pages are set up so you can chat about the animals. This means you can read the story straight through and chat at the end.

AFTER READING...



- ▶ Make up a game using the same sort of rhyme.
"My baby, my baby
My baby, my baby
What do you see?"
- ▶ You don't need to see only colours. Choose any descriptive words.
"I see a happy face." "I see a messy floor." "I see a stripey jumper."
