We are passionate about supporting children and young people at critical life stages. Our key initiative, **READ LEARN SUCCEED**, operates across many geographically and culturally diverse communities. Development of early literacy skills and school readiness is supported through Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. Youth employment and career development are promoted through school and business partnerships.

Grass-roots community engagement is at the core of what we do. United Way Australia (UWA) addresses entrenched disadvantage with a place-based approach. The Hive in Mt Druitt, Sydney is a collaboration with the community to help children start school well. Our goal is to bring about community and systems change and break the cycle of disadvantage.

UWA is a not-for-profit company registered in Australia, has DGR1 status and is also a Public Benevolent Institution. UWA has been operating in Australia for more than 60 years and is governed by a local Board of Directors. UWA is part of a global network of 1700 local United Way organisations in over 37 countries. Our common aim is to identify and resolve pressing community issues and make measurable changes in communities through collaborative partnerships.

AFTER OUR ADVOCACY EFFORTS, THE CHECK-UPS BEFORE SCHOOL PROGRAM (CUBS) PROGRAM WAS SO SUCCESSFUL THAT THE NSW STATE GOVERNMENT TOOK IT OVER TO DELIVER IT TO THE COMMUNITY AT SCALE

The Child Health Linker supported 55 children to access support services they needed such as paediatric appointments or applying for the NDIS.

30 children received a diagnosis as a result of their support from the Child Health Linker, and 72 children were supported to access allied health services such as speech therapy or occupational therapy support
